Camp Medication Policy

The Historical Society of Washington, D.C. camp program has established the following medication policy:

☞ Medications, including prescription and non-prescription drugs, will **NOT** be administered by Historical Society of Washington, D.C. camp staff. This excludes some emergency situations, such as the need for an epi-pen during an allergic reaction

☞ **Campers who must take medications during camp hours will self-administer medication under the observation of camp staff.**

* Parents must document that the child received at least one dose of the medicine at home prior to camp and provide the date of at least one dose taken of prescribed medications. The parents/guardians of the camper must provide the camp with all side effects of the medication.

☞ All medication prescribed must be kept in the original container bearing a pharmacy label which shows the prescription number, date filled, prescribing physician's name, name of medication, directions for taking medication, and the patient's name.

☞ Daily records of distribution of prescription medications will be maintained in the Summer Camp Health Log.

☞ Medication will be stored in a proper storage compartment, under proper storage conditions (as specified by the parent).

☞ All medication will be returned to the parent or guardian or destroyed at the end of the camp session when it is no longer needed.
